<p>Background of the legislation</p>	<p>In the Act on the affairs of people with disabilities last edit in January 2012 it says a special collaborative project involving central government, the local authorities and the national federations of disabled people shall be established to effect the introduction of client-controlled personal assistance. The aim of the project shall be to develop methods of adopting user-controlled personal assistance for disabled people in a deliberate and successful manner. The aim shall be to structure services on the user's terms and under his/her direction, while at the same time they should be as comprehensive as possible within the framework of dissimilar service system.</p> <p>Professional and financial evaluation of the collaborative project shall be completed by the end of 2014, at which time the project shall be formally concluded. Furthermore, the Minister of Welfare shall, not later than the end of 2014, submit a bill proposing that it be established in law that user-controlled personal assistance shall be one of the main forms of services to disabled people; the substance of the bill shall take account of, amongst other things, the experience gained from the implementation of the collaborative project.</p>
